Architecture is the combination of Art with the Science of Building. Art is a creative process in which a new combination of ideas are born.







Using an existing ranch style home, this remodel and addition transformed this home into this spectacular Mission Revival Style Estate. The Mission style materials and detailing was borrowed from local historical homes built in the 20s and 30s. At the same time new invent detailing was incorporated giving a contemporary flair.


The large outdoor room was built specifically to seat a large wedding party for one of the owner's daughters. Most of the living areas and master bedroom open to this outdoor room which has spectacular views of the Ojai countryside. A large daylight basement on the lower level, with exercise and game room opens to a pool area. The first floor plaster mass anchors the structure to its hillside setting at the same time the rooflines above create a playful composition. Planters and arbors are incorporated to blend the home into its natural setting.










































Basement Floor Plan















